

Caixa Cultural, City of Rio de Janeiro, and Municipal Secretary of Culture present:

3rd edition of the International Theater Exchange Festival - NEAPFEST Brazil

The event will feature performances, panels, workshops, lectures, and discussions.

Between November 7th and 14th, the city of Rio de Janeiro will host the third edition of the International Theater Exchange Festival - NEAPFEST Brazil, promoted by the Network of Arts and Emerging Professionals (NEAP). The festival will take place in various popular spaces near the port region and the area known as "Little Africa" in downtown Rio de Janeiro.

The event will kick off at the Nelson Rodrigues Theater on November 7th at 6:30 PM and will include panels at the Technical Arts Center of FUNARTE, workshops, performances, and a samba circle in partnership with Casa Funk at the Museum of Afro-Brazilian History and Culture (MUHCAB). The festival will feature national and international theater performances, including successful shows like "Migrantes," "A Jornada de um Herói," "Menina Mojubá," "Karaíba: Um Musical Originário," "Pelada: a hora da Gaymada," as well as the premiere of the play "Querido Irmão: Faltou ar para dizer" by the Confraria do Impossível, and international performances from Senegal, Chile, the Philippines, Guam, and Angola. The festival will also have discussion panels and free workshops for artists, with 80% of the slots reserved for the Black community, women, and LGBTQIAPN+ individuals.

NEAP is a committee of the International Theatre Institute/UNESCO (ITI/UNESCO), composed of a group of artists and professionals working to facilitate effective communication and collaboration across national and international borders in more

















than 80 countries. Their goal is to create visibility and opportunities, representing young people aged 18 to 35 at the ITI Congress, with a focus on environmental responsibility as a fundamental axis. NEAPFEST Brazil is sponsored by the Municipal Secretary of Culture of Rio de Janeiro through the Carioca Fomentation Program (FOCA), and by Caixa Econômica Federal, with support from FUNARTE and the Federal Government.

The third edition of NEAP will include workshops and thematic panels discussing relevant topics for artists and society as a whole. Internationally respected figures have been invited for these activities, including Emilya Cachapero, director of the Theater Communications Group and a diversity activist in the USA; Teresa Eyring, General Director of the North American Center of the International Theatre Institute; Roberto Cayuqueo, President of ITI Chile, known for his work in theater and indigenous communities of the Mapuche nation; Zhongwen Chen, Deputy Director-General of the International Theatre Institute Global; Tarcísio Motta, federal deputy; and the Culture Coordinator of UNESCO Brazil.

In addition to being a celebration of cultural and artistic diversity, NEAPFEST Brazil aims to promote international exchange between Brazilian theater artists and delegations from 12 countries on the theme of diasporas, focusing on the transition from the International Decade for People of African Descent to the International Decade of Indigenous Languages declared by UNESCO. During the event, the Regional Council of the Americas will also convene, where representatives from the Americas will gather to create strategies for international collaboration, benefiting the exchange, residencies, and the circulation of theater groups throughout the continent.

NEAPFEST Brazil promises to be a milestone in the international theater scene, marking not only the revival of activities at the Brazil Center of ITI, which had been

















closed since 2017, but also strengthening cultural and artistic relations between Brazil and the world.

AWARDS AT THE EVENT

The event's opening will also include the presentation of the Rubens Barbot Awards, celebrating national and international figures who actively support young emerging artists in their artistic journey with a focus on sustainable development.

Each honoree, ten Brazilians and ten foreigners, will receive a unique statuette created by the artist Tarso Tabu, who uses recyclable materials and portrays the lives of waste pickers in Rio de Janeiro, highlighting the importance of recycling workers in major cities.

The Rubens Barbot Award pays tribute to the contemporary Gaúcho costume designer, dancer, and choreographer, the founder of the Rubens Barbot Dance Company, who, along with his partner Gatto Larsen, was active in the cultural Quilombo Terreiro Contemporâneo for twenty years in Rio de Janeiro. Currently managed by the theatrical company Confraria do Impossível, the headquarters received the 2020 Shell Innovation Award for its significant contributions to the promotion and development of Black art in Rio de Janeiro.

The artist passed away in 2022 and was a living icon in Brazilian contemporary dance and a representative of Black art in the country. The festival is named after Rubens Barbot in recognition of his involvement and dedication to the artistic and personal development of promising young artists, as well as his commitment to creating sets and costumes with sustainable materials.
